OPERATIONALIZATION PROCESS


- 2 year process (2018-2019) agreed by GA
- Communication sent by Secretariat in January of 2018 to Regional Coordinators (Council members Honorary members and Focal Points) to identify proposals for the process
- Regionalization Committee/ Council meetings/ G A (Montreal June 2018) make recommendations
- Still to take place
 - Regional Assemblies proposals (2018)
 - General Assembly approval (Nov. 2018)
 - Implementation starting in 2019 (pilot)

ICCA REGIONS/SUBREGIONS TO BE DEFINED BY REGIONAL ICCA MEMBERS (REGIONAL ASSEMBLIES

- Criteria to be considered in the regionalization process (Regions and sub regions):
 - Membership
 - Culture/language /history
 - Ecosystems
 - Political context
 - Proximity
 - Operational
 - Financial

Key topics/ recommendations to be addressed in the regionalization process

• Structure/ governance/ membership

- Functions (global and regional)
- Funding

Structure/governance/membership

- Proposed regional structure
 - National focal points
 - Regional Assemblies
 - Secretariat
- Acknowledge that regional structures can be defined by regions
- Relationship with the global structure: through **regional** representation at the ICCA **Council**

Regional functions

- Revise policy and strategies (alerts, communications, fundraising) to ensure they respond to regional needs
- Fundraising and resource mobilization
- Capacity building
- Research/ Generating and exchanging knowledge
- Supporting / recruiting membership

... Regional functions

- Building/ strengthening networks
- Advocacy/ supporting members
- Developing and maintaining data base
- Identifying regional priorities/ plans
- Active engagement in policy definition and implementation
- Facilitating communications at all levels

Funding

- a. Membership fees:
 - Collected centrally
 - Partly distributed regionally
- b. Fundraising:
 - Intensify fundraising efforts at all levels
 - Develop fundraising protocols / guidelines (global level)
 - Certain minimum amount (tbd) allocated to each region from global level
- c. Annual budget:
 - Depends on the regional work plan
 - This should include not only coordinators' time but also administration, communications, travel, assemblies, other initiatives, etc.
- d. Annual remuneration:
 - Regional coordinators should move to either fairly remunerated part-time (50%) or full-time – no longer semi-volunteer
