Fundraising Activity 2019

- Approach to fundraising in line with our Strategic Plan i.e., intentional shift from small number of 'original' funders to more diverse funders for both core and programmatic activities (including specific themes)
 - Currently undergoing "Emerge Process" review and development of fundraising strategy
- Key issues to consider in the future:
 - Identifying what 'aligned funders' means for the Consortium and focusing on those
 - Fundraising in the context of the regionalisation process (roles and responsibilities of Regional Hubs and Councils / Global Secretariat and Council)

Ongoing funding from previous years

- SwedBio funding for finalising two videos on ICCAs and the Consortium – came to end in March 2019
- Anonymous Donor funding for core costs and initial leadership transition meeting came to an end in April 2019
- The Christensen Fund ongoing funding for core costs, communication and international policy advocacy – came to an end on 30 June 2019
- UNDP GEF SGP Global Support Initiative for ICCAs ongoing funding due to end 31 December 2019 but likely extension

Successful Proposals 2019

- Tikva Grassroots Empowerment Fund of Tides Foundation funding received to support the GA and associated meetings
- SwedBio funding received to develop a critical mass of support in around 10 countries, international policy work and the GA and associated meetings
- The Christensen Fund successful proposal to focus on post-2020 CBD strategic initiatives, international policy work and the GA and associated meetings
- Anonymous Donor successful proposal to cover a major leadership transition meeting and significant core costs
- WWF-International Inclusive Conservation funding received for participation of Consortium representatives to offer advice for the development of the High Impact Initiative on People Protecting Landscapes and Seascapes
- Conservation through Reconciliation Partnership successful proposal by University of Guelph, Canada (Consortium as partner)

Proposals Outstanding / In Progress 2019

- Oak Foundation marine proposal submitted large proposal involving many Members
- Wyss Foundation's Campaign for Nature concept note submitted for participation of indigenous peoples and local communities in the post-2020 global biodiversity framework
- MacArthur Foundation large proposal submitted by Cicada and McGill University in collaboration with the Consortium
- Voice supporting Natural Justice to develop a proposal on defending territories of life and their defenders in Africa
- Commonwealth Foundation supporting Zambia Community Based Natural Resource Management Forum to develop a proposal on ICCAs in Zambia

Future possibilities

- GSI Phase II with partners and Members at discussion stage, may become several proposals
- Large scale funding around inclusive conservation e.g., through Global Environment Facility, Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs
- Oceans 5 possible co-funding with Oak Foundation proposal
- National Geographic Society communications, post-2020 campaigns
- Environmental Defenders Collaborative invitation to submit a proposal for a first grant
- International Funders for Indigenous Peoples possible smaller grants for Members
- Looking at a range of other funders for both core and programmatic costs
